


Christ, from Whom All Blessings Flow

saints below,**




**hear us, who

all in all.**




**3. Move and actuate

to each divide;**




**placed according

our work fulfill;**




**4. Never from thy

each other prove;**




**use the grace

the art of God.**




**5. Many are we
