


**1. For all the saints,

before the world confessed,**




**thy name, O Jesus,


**2. Thou wast their rock,

in the well-fought fight;**




**thou, in the darkness

who nobly fought of old,**




**and win with them


**4. O blest communion,

they in glory shine;**




**yet all are one

the distant triumph song,**




**and hearts are brave
