


Glorious Things of Thee Are Spoken


**1. Glorious things of

his own abode.**




**On the Rock

thy sure repose?**




**With salvation's

at all thy foes.**




**2. See, the streams

eternal love,**




**well supply thy

want remove.**




**Who can faint while

from age to age.**




**3. Round each

and fire appear**




**for a glory

Lord is near!**




**Thus deriving
